

Product Search on www.trestlewood.com

www.trestlewood.com is designed around product search, with an eye towards helping you find the right products for your project as efficiently as possible.

You can initiate a product search with any of the following tools:

1. **Search our Wood Products Tool.** Overlay on home page. Provide any target dimension(s), other desired characteristics, and/or text string, then click the Search button. Left menu tools are available to further narrow results. Results can include a mix of product types (flooring, timbers, siding, lumber, mantels, and accent walls.)
2. **Product Selection Tools.** Accessible from the Product section of the web site header and the body of the home page. There is a selection tool for each of six product types - Flooring, Timbers, Siding, Lumber, Mantels, and Accent Walls. Similar to the Search our Wood Products tool, except that results are for one particular product type.
3. **Overall Web Site Text Search.** Text search box is in the upper right corner of the web site header (to the left of Quote List and Shopping Cart buttons.) Enter a text string and click on the search icon. Results include any products with text that matches the text string. Search results are broken into 6 tabs - 3 product-related tabs (Product Lines, Products, Barcodes) and 3 non-product-related tabs (Photos, Documents, Other.)

3 Product Tabs

All product search tools display product search results under 3 tabs: Product Lines, Products, and Barcodes. These 3 tabs are ordered (left to right) from most general to most specific and can be thought of as follows:

Product Line - a set of characteristics defined and used by Trestlewood to group materials (including Products and Barcodes) of a similar type and general look and feel.

Product - a subset of materials associated with a Product Line - often involves more narrowly defined dimensions and/or other characteristics than defined for the overall product line; sometimes involves a specific source/batch of materials with less variation in characteristics/look than at the Product Line level.

Barcode - a specific piece (usually mantel or timber) or unit (usually flooring, siding, lumber, or accent wall.) One of a kind - when you purchase a barcode, you get that specific piece/unit and it is no longer available for anyone else to purchase.
